# **Buninyong RSL**

Twenty members gathered for the February meeting and joined in the comradeship of the group.

Concern had been raised at the deterioration of the Cambrian Hill Memorial Avenue in the Golden Plains Shire. The shire has inspected the Avenue with an arborist and the sub branch awaits the outcome of plans to rejuvenate the trees in the avenue especially ahead of the Centenary of Anzac.

The annual RSL golf day will be held at the Buninyong Golf Club on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> April.

The most recent statue in Sturt Street Ballarat is of Pompey Elliott. Born at west Charlton in 1878, educated at Ballarat and Ormond Colleges, champion athlete, barrister and solicitor and member of the Upper House. Served in South Africa 1900-02, awarded the DCM, commissioned and Mentioned in Dispatches. In August 1914 appointed to command the 7<sup>th</sup> Battalion, wounded at the Gallipoli landing 25/4/15. Commenced service on the Western front in July 1916. He fought in most of the great battles of the AIF.

Unable to change the tactics at Fromelles but had victory at Polygon Wood and Villers-Bretonneux. As a brigadier-general it was common to find Pompey Elliott in the front lines gathering intelligence and encouraging his troops. He died in 1931.

Celebrations in Ballarat on 19<sup>th</sup> June will honour one of Australia's finest military leaders.

Next time when you have time to stroll along the statues in Sturt Street, take note of the number and variety.

A bright winter day is ideal for strolling along the statues in the Sturt street median. Clear of the shadows they now stand sharp and represent many military and community highlights that have shape our community.

# Working from a Wider View

My nephew Mark's Facebook photo showed a happy scene: his daughters enjoying industrial-strength sundaes while sitting outside an ice-cream parlour under a huge umbrella.

Checking his message about the photo's top right-hand corner, we then noticed two policemen handcuffing a suspect, with his back to the camera. While Mark was focusing on his foreground, he was completely unaware of his new voluntary crime reporting role!

Our ability to concentrate on daily routines, or on handling our crises, often blinds us to others' needs or hopes—even right under our noses. Yet without our concentrating, we could become so overstimulated that we never get anything done.

"The eye of God" is a writer's term for a story's overall perspective and setting. This "eye" keeps knitting seemingly-unrelated factors together, so you can't put the book down. Or it conceals these factors until a full disclosure solves the mystery—or a punch line reveals the joke.

If you've ever been criticised or—more happily—praised for something you have either forgotten or never knew about; you will have experienced the eye of God up close and personally.

For nothing escapes God's notice—bad or good. He exposes our pretences, but he also sees (and believes in) our potential. And while we live through our own autobiographies, he invites us to plug into his belief in our potential. Then even routines can be energised by hope that's generous enough to stimulate hope and healthy confidence among others within our own circles of influence.

Marmalade entries came from every State for the Buninyong Marvellous Marmalade Fair held on Sunday 3rd February, 2012 in the Buninyong Town Hall.

From Perth region, Bondi Beach, Georgetown on north Queensland's Savannah Way – and Relbia in Tasmania. There was a strong local contingent, plus Creswick, Melbourne, Mansfield as well as the enthusiastic Blayney mob in central NSW who promised to come down in support if they were selected in the Australian XI!

Entry fees totalled over \$1,000 and we were able to donate a cheque totalling \$1,024 to Ballarat Home Hospice Care and \$8 each to two other palliative care Hospices that were nominated. This was a great result and the Hospice aged care organisation was extraordinarily grateful.

We were very fortunate in having three expert CWA judges Barbara Porter, Sue Gass and Janette O'Keefe to judge all entries and score these out of 20 points. Deputy Vice President of CWA Victoria, Dorothy Coombe, addressed the crowd on the day and spoke of the CWA's training and accreditation program for Judges as well as the benefits of this marmalade initiative to community.

The Judges awarded points to each anonymous entry - for Presentation (max. 2); Colour (5); Consistency, texture, quality (6) and Flavour, Aroma (7) totalling 20. They also gave comments if they felt they could help the marmalade-maker to improve – perhaps we could all increase our scores by a mere 1 or 2 each year?

And now to the XIs and Chief Selector, Roland Rocchiccioli, thespian, raconteur, playwrite, interviewer of the King of Greece, Shirley Bassey and a couple of 007s amongst many others. Roland selected both XIs in conjunction with Barbara, Sue and Janette in what was a delightful example of camaraderie and unanimity! The XIs are two powerful teams – especially the Australian XI with two perfect scores!

The task, however, is not necessarily to select the eleven highest scores but to select an all-round team - Australia wouldn't send an Ashes Test team of all fast bowlers or spinners or batsmen. The aim being to slip in a googly or two, some spin, something fast and good with the gloves. Hopefully the English will be bamboozled! You can see that Buninyong has had a bit of fun over the past few years, when, after we lost the Ashes, we challenged our friendly adversaries the Poms to something else they claim to have invented!

We are most grateful to Barbara, Sue, Janette and Roland for the professional job that they all did. Our thanks also go to all entrants and to our volunteer Committee who have done a tremendous amount of work to put on the Buninyong Marvellous Marmalade Fair for 2013.
