She is an avid fruit and vegetable grower and bottler and insists on sourcing the freshest of the fresh for all ingredients. She has extensive experience cooking at the Royal Melbourne Show and as a judge for the CWA and the Victorian Agricultural Societies Association. Our committee is most grateful to Barbara who has very kindly donated her time and expertise to help raise funds for the MarmalAshes Buninyong Marmalade Association by preparing this dinner. Also our thanks go to Buninyong FoodWorks Supermarket for donating the meat.

After all, the Australian XI lost the MarmalAshes this year to a powerful England XI at the International Awards held in Cumbria last March, even though we had won for the previous three years. 



Forum explores range of ideas for Civic Hall

Do we change the use of the Civic Hall? Or change the building? Do we want large, or small changes? Are there things we want to keep? These were some of the questions posed by Ammon Beyerle, one of the speakers at Sunday's forum, *Civic Hall – Reopen, Revitalize!*

Beyerle, Co Director of Here Studio, and a founder of CoWorking, is based in Ballarat, and is currently completing his PhD in participatory architectural practice.

At the forum he showed images of some of his favourite arts and community spaces in Europe and Australia that have been developed by creatively adapting old buildings.

Paris' Museé D'Orsay was once a railway station and London's Tate Modern, a power station. Sydney's Museum of Contemporary Art was a maritime services building. Each has created imaginative contemporary spaces within old buildings to become major arts and tourism icons.

Jeremy Gaden, Director of The Substation, Newport, gave an inspiring account of how a derelict 1915 railway substation, closed since the 1960s, has become a leading contemporary performance and visual art space, enhancing liveability in the western suburbs.

Long considered an eyesore that nobody wanted, its rejuvenation began with two people and finally involved the whole community. A partnership was formed with Victoria University and it became an important Work for the Dole project. Today businesses nearby are thriving and there are fewer closed shops.

Gaden said that a key problem was that the building was never designed to accommodate people. However the advantages of utilising a character-filled structure with a long past, has far outweighed any disadvantages. He offered his assistance and expertise to Ballarat in its quest to retain the Civic Hall for community purposes.

Local historian and writer, Phil Roberts, spoke of the \$5 million process to restore the Ballarat Mechanics Institute. The meticulous restoration was achieved in stages, over fifteen years, with funding mainly from the Brumby state government, major philanthropic trusts, local service clubs and businesses.

A secretary and long-term board member of the Mechanics Institute, Roberts advised Civic Hall proponents not to cling too closely to its past uses, and to seek professional architectural advice.

Save Civic Hall organisers were very happy with the high quality of speakers, the usefulness of information imparted, and the audience response.

The forum grew out of plans to curate an exhibition of Civic Hall memorabilia, to be held early next year.

Save Civic Hall is currently continuing discussions with the City of Ballarat regarding their proposed community engagement process. This is seen as a timely process to heal the rift between Council and community and to further discuss some of the ideas put forth at the forum.

Refugee Film Fest at Loreto

How did an elderly knitter in rural Tasmania become best mates with a young Afghani refugee in a detention centre?

Mary Meets Mohammad is a gentle, warm-hearted documentary that shows how a group of craft workers in Tasmania began to knit hats for and then visit young asylum seekers in a nearby detention centre.

Initial distrust and dislike developed into such strong bonds with the community that they grieved when the detention centre was closed.

This is one of three superb films that make up a mini film festival being shown as part of Refugee Week at Loreto College, 1600 Sturt Street, 4 – 8.30pm on Tuesday 17 June.

Between the Devil and the Deep Blue Sea brings home the risks people take in their search for a safe haven from war-torn countries, and the frustrations of the current system.

Hope is the story of Amal Basry, a woman who was one of only seven people to make it to Australia when four hundred boarded a boat for Australia.

The Film Fest is being organised by Ballarat Rural Australians for Refugees (formerly known as Ballarat ARA Circle of Friends). Admission is free and open to all, with screenings at 4pm, 5pm and 6.30pm.

Tea and coffee is available between screenings and there's a chance to meet other people concerned about the plight of refugees.
